#### **Harvest Festival**

Next week we will be celebrating and talking about harvest festival in school. We will be making a collection for the Caterham Food Bank throughout the week. The Caterham Foodbank is part of a nationwide network of foodbanks, supported by The Trussell Trust, working to combat poverty and hunger across the UK. They provide three days' nutritionally balanced emergency food and support to local people who are referred to them in crisis. No-one in our community should have to face going hungry.

Over 90% of the food distributed by foodbanks in The Trussell Trust network is donated by the public – that's why your food donations are absolutely vital. They would welcome donations of non-perishable food items but particularly long life fruit juice, small packets of tea bags, small jars of instant coffee and instant mashed potato. Please hand any donations in to the school office. We will be delivering the donations to the Caterham Foodbank on Friday 21st October.
