#### Start and end of the day procedures

As communicated at the end of last term, there is now a slight change to the start and end of day procedures to make them more effective. The official time for the start of the day is 8.45am to ensure that learning can begin at 8.55am. Registers will be taken at 8.55am to ensure learning can begin immediately after this. Key Stage 1 children will continue to use the Key Stage 1 door to enter through at 8.45am. For this week only, parents in Year 1 are welcome to settle their child in the classroom at the start of the day, entering through Beech classroom door. From Monday, we ask that children enter the Key Stage 1 door with Year 2 and parents say goodbye at the door. It will be closed at 8.55am for registers to be taken and any child who arrives after this will need to sign in as late at the School Office.

For Key Stage 2, it is expected that the children line up at their class sign post at 8.45am for the class teachers to collect their classes and lead them in. It is expected that children will be at school and ready to enter with the rest of their class however if your child finds their class has already entered school, they will need to enter school through the main reception door. The main entrance door will also be closed at 8.55am to ensure registers are completed and learning can begin promptly. Again any child who arrives after this will need to sign in as late at the School Office.

For Reception children, they will enter through the main entrance at 8.45am when the bell sounds and be taken to the Reception block by their parents, for registers at 8.55am and Nursery children will enter through the Nursery entrance at 8.50am when the doors open.

Members of the School Leadership Team along with Phase Leaders will be on the Playground from 8.30am every day for any problems, concerns or messages you may have.

At the end of the school day, similar procedures will take place. Reception children will leave from the Nursery door at 3.00pm with the class teachers dismissing them. Year 1 will leave school from Beech class door and Year 2 will leave from the Key Stage 1 door at 3.00pm. For Key Stage 2, the class teachers will lead the children onto the front playground and return them to their class sign post for dismissal at 3.10pm.

Could we please ask parents to wait in the centre of the playground to ensure there is adequate space for the children to be dismissed properly.

#### Uniform

We are pleased to see children looking very smart and proud in their Hillcroft uniform this term. At Hillcroft, we believe that school uniform is an important part of school life and we are expecting all children to attend school in full school uniform for daily attendance. If children do attend school without elements of the school uniform, they will be loaned uniform to wear. This includes footwear and children will be asked to change into black school plimsolls from the school office should they not be in appropriate footwear. If you are in any doubt about uniform, please see the school policy on the website.

## Curriculum

This year we have introduced a new Curriculum called Cornerstones. It provides our children with a broad, rich and engaging curriculum which excites and motivates children. It ensures full and comprehensive coverage of the 2014 Primary National Curriculum of national expectations. The curriculum is delivered through termly or half termly Imaginative Learning Projects which provides a rich menu of exciting and motivating learning activities that make creative links between all aspects of the children's learning. It encourages children to become engaged in their learning, use their imagination to learn and develop skills and then apply their learning to engaging contexts. These are known as the four stages of learning in each Imaginative Learning Project:

- Engage
- Develop
- Innovate
- Express.
