KS2 Fruit Stall

The School Council launched a fruit stall for KS2 today. It is an enterprise initiative they have chosen following consultation with their peers and it links in with our healthy living ethos. Children in KS1 are provided with free fruit at break time as part of the School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme (SFVS). The scheme provides one of their 5 a day portions and helps to increase awareness of the importance of eating fruit and vegetables, encouraging healthy eating habits that can be carried into later life. Children in KS2 are able to bring fruit in to school to eat at break time, or they can purchase fruit from the fruit stall from Monday 26th February. The fruit is being ordered from SFVS. Initially the fruit stall will run on a Monday. It will offer apples and pears at 20p each, and possibly other fruits if available. If your child would like to buy fruit on a Monday, please can we ask that they come to school with the correct money to prevent any problems with lost change etc. The children may like to buy fruit for the whole week, which they can keep in their tray in class for break time.

The fruit stall was not as busy as we had hoped today, maybe the wintery weather put everyone off! We hope it will be more popular next week now it has been launched and the children know what to expect.
