Please read this if you have used, know people who have used or anyone who was hoping to use the Caterham Children's Centre.

The consultation which SCC have launched this week proposes closing all the Children's Centre buildings in Tandridge except the one in Caterham, which would become a hub for "Family Resilience". The loss of the Centre in Hurst Green, and the support it gives for families there and in Godstone, is a tragic loss and we need to fight to keep it as a satellite centre so the families can continue to be supported.

At the moment we are able to work closely with our community to support families who need us, if the number of centres is cut, the services will be cut and we won't be able to work so closely with our local community.
