This term our curriculum school focus is Art. We have been focussing on our basic art skills: sketching, mark-making and mixing and blending paints.


The teachers have even been practising and improving their skills, in staff development and training.

Each year group is concentrating on the following:

- Year 1: Kendra Haste (Sculptural animals) in Paws, Claws and Whiskers
- Year 2: Mixed media leading to an art exhibition, in Muck, Mess and Mixtures
- Year 3: Graffiti, in Urban Pioneers
- Year 4: The Great Wave, in Blue Abyss
- Year 5: Salvador Dali, The persistence of Memory, in Time Travellers
- Year 6: Expressionism and Impressionism, in Gallery Rebels

We are all making lots of progress and are enjoying calm, mindful art time. As always, if you are a parent/carer with any special art skills you think might come in handy, please get in touch with your child's teacher or Mrs Tapley - our art subject leader. We hope to produce some fantastic final pieces and can't wait to share our new skills with you.

#### **Harvest Festival**



We are celebrating Harvest Festival on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> October with an assembly led by Oakhall Church.
