#### The EU Settlement Scheme

We have been advised to inform any staff, parents or carers of pupils who are EU, EEA or Swiss citizens that they need to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living in the UK after 2020.

Please read the guidance on EU Settlement Scheme to find out who needs to apply.

Irish citizens' right to live in the UK will not change when the UK leaves the EU. Irish citizens do not need to apply for the EU Settlement Scheme, but their family members, who are not Irish or British citizens, will need to.

#### **Cashless School**

Hillcroft is becoming a cashless school. Please pay for school meals, workshops and trips via Wisepay. If you do not know your Wisepay log in please contact the office. The only time we will ask for a cash payment is for things like charity / sundry collections. Thank you.
