Oliver Jeffers' "Here we Are: Notes for Living on Planet Earth"



As part of our transition back to school, all of our learning centred through Oliver Jeffers' "Here we Are book". This book focuses upon making sense of the world around us, and was taught from Year 1 up to Year 6 through all subjects. Below are some of the wonderful examples of learning that the children completed.

In year 1, the children learnt all about what it means to be a human being, and drew pictures of themselves. They also learnt that it is important to love who we are and to treat other people like we would like to be treated.



At the older end of the school, Year 5 drew pictures of their 'safe' places where we felt calm and relaxed.







# Other Curriculum Updates:

# <u>Maths:</u>

As we start a new year we are keen to re-engage the children with maths and a great way to do this is through the Numbots and TT Rockstars app. Every child from Year 1 to Year 6 should have a username and password which they can use to access both programs.

TT Rockstars is more suited to KS2, with children who are ready to learn their Times Tables and like a bit of competition. You can even choose to battle against a teacher! Numbots is perfect for all ages and really helps to secure basic number facts and work on mathematical fluency. The apps are free to download onto a phone or tablet or play using your home PC.

If your child needs their username and password please email me with their name and class and I will send you the details. Over lockdown we had a fantastic competition between students and staff, with over 200,00 correct answers. Amazing fun and good practise for all of us!

# <u>Reading:</u>

Reading is a crucial aspect of children's learning. Sharing a story is a valuable experience for introducing new vocabulary, improving understanding and most of all, enjoyment.

As part of home learning, children are expected to read for at least 10 minutes everyday.

There are many ways to source stories: borrowing books from school, registering with your local library (many have ebooks available), listening to a audio book.
