We have been learning...

Year 2

In Year 2, we have been learning about Materials in Science; we went outside to find and identify different properties. We were then able to use natural materials to make animal homes around our school field.



Another material we have used is paper! We constructed our own bridges out of paper and tested to see if they could hold some weight...some worked better than others!



Year 6

In Year 6, we have been sharpening our arithmetic skills and are looking forward to learning about Fractions. We are developing our knowledge of The Write Stuff approach to writing by following the expert Jane Considine with her live lessons on YouTube. We have also been looking at the life and work of Charles Darwin; using our sketching skills to draw some of the animals he discovered in the Galapagos Islands. Parent Ambassadors – improving the link between home and school!

Firstly, I would like to thank you for your input in the Parent Engagement questionnaire that I sent out last term. Your responses were invaluable - following my collation of them, they have been central to my development of the Parent Ambassador strategy at Hillcroft. Within this, there are three main roles that a parent or carer could become involved in, which are outlined below:

- 1. **Communication and Community:** The role of these Parent Ambassadors are similar to that of a Class or Year Group rep; working with the school community to ensure that positive and helpful communication is maintained between school and home.
- 2. **Project Based:** We know that many parents and carers have skills that could contribute and develop areas of our curriculum. However, we also recognise that many parents are very busy. Therefore, this role would be an adhoc one; sharing the skills that you have and then working with the school on one-off projects.
- 3. Parent Forum: This Parent Ambassador role focuses more upon the School's Key Priorities and Curriculum areas and would act as a termly forum to discuss and collaborate on strategic decisions in relation to these. A parent or carer may have a specific area of interest such as Reading or Diversity that we could focus on developing and promoting across the school, alongside myself and the Curriculum leads.
