Attendance Notice:

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

We were very lucky to have Mr Beagley from Surrey Arts join us for a special music assembly on Thursday 5th May of KS2 children. He is a Brass specialist and demonstrated the trumpet, the French horn, trombone, tuba and the euphonium. The children loved hearing the different sounds the instruments made!



Excitingly, Mr Beagley is able to offer brass or piano music lessons to KS2 children at Hillcroft, so, if your child has been inspired, they can attend a group or individual lesson.

Please state on the application form whether your child would like to learn brass or piano at Hillcroft School.

He offers individual piano lessons and individual or group brass lessons. If your child would like to learn the piano, then they must have access to a piano or keyboard at home so that they may practise but the brass instruments can be hired from Surrey Arts.

Surrey Arts also offer concessions for low-income families and carers. If you are interested in your child learning an instrument and believe that you would be eligible for this, then please look at this link (under concessions).


Reading Ambassador update!

A message from Mrs Pearson.

This week my news update is about "The hand model of the brain." This model explains how your brain reacts when you are feeling sad, angry or stressed. It can help to show children visually how, when they lift their fingers ("flip their lid"), their thinking brain is no longer connected to their feelings. In this model, the palm represents our basic bodily functions, the thumb represents feelings such as anger or stress and lives tucked into the palm, in the 'downstairs' brain. The other fingers represent the thinking parts, which live in our 'upstairs' brain. Using this model, your child can show you when they feel angry or stressed if they are not able to voice it.




Watch this video with your children so that they will understand how their brain works when feeling sad, angry and stressed.




Lucy wakes up one morning to discover something very strange indeed. All the grown-ups in her town have disappeared.
