Start of the day procedures

A reminder that the school gates onto the playground open at 8.30am and the school doors open at 8.35am. Children have between **8.35-8.45am** to come into school via the following entrances:

Year groups	Entrance
Nursery	Nursery entrance door.
Reception	Shelter on the front playground.
Year 1	Year 1 door
Year 2	Nursery entrance door
KS2	Main entrance

The gates will close promptly at 8.45am, after which the class registers will be taken and your child will be recorded as late.

End of the day procedures

At the end of the day, KS1 and KS2 children come onto the front playground and are dismissed by the class teacher. Reception children are dismissed from the shelter and Nursery children are dismissed from the Nursery entrance door.

The timings for the end of the day are as follows:

Year groups	Time

Year 3 & 4	3.10pm
Year 5 & 6	3.15pm

If you have children finishing at different times of the afternoon, then it is expected that you will pick up at their allotted times. If your child has not been collected by 3.20pm then they will be sent to the office. Please see Late Collection Policy available on the website for more information.

Communication

We pride ourselves on having an open door policy and therefore we encourage parents to discuss any aspect of your child's experiences with us. In the first instance this communication should take place with your child's class teacher. We prefer to do this face to face if possible, however we appreciate this can be difficult for some parents and therefore email correspondence is also acceptable. Teachers' email addresses are available on the school website.

In order to ensure anything that arises for your child/children can be dealt with in a professional and productive manner, we appreciate parents speaking directly to the school, rather than over social media. As a school, we appreciate that social media is part of everyday life however it is not an appropriate platform for any concerns or worries you have about the school or your child. In many instances, it can be upsetting and offensive to others which in turn can be damaging. Therefore again, we would appreciate any concerns being discussed directly with us.

If any of your or your child's personal details, including contact details, of your child/children have changed over the Summer break then please ensure you inform the office as soon as possible. It is our expectation that we have **at least three** contact numbers for each child. This is a safeguarding requirement which is set out to ensure we can make contact with the family in the event of an emergency.

School Uniform

It is a pleasure to see the children looking so smart at the start of the new academic year. It is expected that all children are adhering to the correct school uniform and wearing this on a daily basis. We believe uniform is an important aspect to a child's education, giving them pride about their appearance and the school and therefore we appreciate your ongoing support with this. PE

On the day your child has PE they will continue to wear their PE kit to school and stay in it during the day to avoid the need for changing. PE lessons will commence w/b 5th September. The PE timetable for this term is as follows:

Children's Birthdays / handing out sweets

As a school we have a large number of children with a range of allergies, we are also a nut free and healthy eating school and therefore are unable to hand out sweets / gifts to other children. If your child wishes to hand out treats on their birthday then this must be organised outside of school.

GDPR

For GDPR reasons we are unable to hand out classlists with the children's names on them. This includes a list of first names.

Breaktime fruit

As part of the Governments School Fruit & Vegetable Scheme, EYFS and KS1 children are provided with free fruit every day. Children in KS2 are welcome to bring in their own fruit for breaktime if they wish.
