Have you noticed that sometimes children can manage a task and the next day or time, they cannot?

Do you find yourself telling them this?

We all have a window of tolerance.

Sometimes it is big and we manage difficult things because we have sufficient emotional energy to cope: we are not tired, hungry, feel poorly, lonely or sad.

When we are in our window of tolerance, we feel just right!

We are calm but not tired.

We are alert but not anxious.

We can cope with daily challenges as they happen.

On the days children "Can't do", ask yourself if they are feeling hungry, frustrated, lonely or tired and notice this for yourself too!

Roma – Year 5 – for winning 3rd place in her Maths Competition


Lewis – Year 3 – for his fantastic football skills




Hair Love


Wild!




Ellie and the Cat

Black and British

Author: David Olusoga

David Olusoga is a British-Nigerian historian, author, presenter and BAFTA winning film-maker. In this version of his book that is specifically for readers aged 9 and above, David Olusoga provides the reader with an essential introduction to 1,800 years of Black British History. Throughout the book, the impact of Black people on British history is outlined from the Roman times through to the twentieth century. Each chapter is short and engaging and full of interesting historical facts that are not always as publicised as they should be.

Attendance Notice:

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

Caterham Foodbank:





News!

Caterham Foodbank continues to offer 3 days emergency food to those in food poverty, but we are so much more than just food. We offer all clients, compassion, a hot drink and a listening ear.

Although we are still signposting and working collaboratively with other services, we have also managed to secure a financial inclusion grant form the Trussell Trust. This has enabled us to provide a Citizens Advice Bureau advisor in both Foodbanks at Caterham Baptist Church and Oakhall to help clients with any issues they may have. Clients may have many problems including issues with benefits, low income and energy debt. The aim here is for both income maximisation along with budgeting and debt help.

In light of the recent energy crisis more people are struggling and the decision was made by trustees to try and help people with this. Caterham Foodbank has therefore signed up to work with the Fuelbank Foundation www.fuelbankfoundation.org. and while funding lasts and subject to criteria being met, we are able to offer small energy vouchers to those at immediate risk of disconnection or already disconnected and choosing food over heat. We are also grateful to the Caterham, Oxted and Godstone Lions for supporting this project with a financial donation.

It won't come as any surprise that the need for our service isn't diminishing and we are expecting it to continue to rise due to the increase in fuel prices and the cost of living. As our number of users increase we are also currently seeing a fall in donations. This could be for a number of reasons but may just be that less people are in a position of being able to help.

We are very grateful for all the recent Harvest donations which have temporarily refilled our emptying shelves but are unsure how long this will last.

We are already thinking about our Tesco Christmas Collection on the 1st-3rd December which will give our stocks and extra boost. Also because Tesco also tops up these donations based on the weight this adds extra value for us. We are now starting to gather referrals for our Christmas Hampers and it will be all hands on deck to pack these at the end of this month.

Thank you so much for your continued support of the foodbank. We continue to look forward to a day when our service is no longer needed because everyone has enough for the basics, but until that time comes, with your support we'll do all we can to help those in crisis.


