Curriculum

Children in all year groups have embraced their Wider Curriculum learning with some engaging and immersive learning experiences. As a whole school we are tackling the question of 'How can data help us understand the world around us?'.

This is what the children are learning about across the school

- Children in Early Years will be turning their focus to all things bread, and exploring it with their senses.
- Y1 will be setting the scene and exploring curtains as they start to think about what makes a good curtain.
- Y2 will be thinking all things coats and the different materials coats are made of including cutting up a coat and pulling out the insides!
- Y3 will be building upon their learning on Wheels Day and thinking about how friction affects a moving object.
- Y4 will continue to explore how temperature can affect states of matter.
- Y5 are looking forward to carrying out various experiments linked to separating different materials
- Y6 are going to be thinking about the electrical components of a deconstructed hairdryer and what each part specifically does.

Amelie- Year 2, took part in her first 2k run and completed it in a time of 12:20. We were very impressed with her determination.




Nikki- Year 5, has made a book about Henry VIII wives. She has worked very hard at

Lift each flap to find all sorts of funny animal surprises, before discovering where cheeky Spot has been hiding.



Attendance Notice:

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

A polite reminder, that we are a Healthy and Nut Free school, so please could packed lunches consist of the below:

School ties (KS2):

E-Safety Update from Mrs Winsor

Updated Supervision Features for FB Messenger and Instagram

In June 2023 Meta rolled out some new parental features for FB Messenger and Instagram. As of 30th August, these updates are now available globally.

Specific updates for Messenger:

- View how much time the child spends on the app.
- Updates on their contact list.
- Notification if the child reports someone.
- View who can message their child.
- View who can see their child's stories.

Specific updates for Instagram:

Before being able to message someone, who doesn't follow them, people must now send
a text only invite to connect (in other words, no more unwanted explicit photos from
people you don't follow). No further interaction can take place unless the recipient
accepts the invite.
