Nurture Inspire Strive

I hope you all had a lovely half term and that your children have enjoyed the first few weeks back into Autumn 2. Yet again, there has been lots of fantastic learning going on, with the children all starting their new Autumn 2 topics. Here is an overview of what each year group will be focusing on this half term:

- Nursery will be thinking about how light is used in celebrations
- Early Years are thinking about why animals use shelters and creating a shelter for a small animal
- Y1 will be thinking about which structures are significant to our local area and making a structure inspired by our local history
- Y2 will be turning their focus to the Great Fire of London and thinking about how this significant event has influenced the structures we have today. They will be making a structure inspired by either 1666 London or Modern-day London
- Y3 will be looking at prehistoric Britain and will be creating a wattle and daub structure, as well as a cave painting
- Y4 will be looking at all things Romans! Their structure will be influenced by Roman architecture
- Y5 are focusing on the Ancient Egyptians and will be considering the best mechanical device to move water or a heavy load
- Y6 will be thinking about WW2 and exploring the social impact of it on society. They will then aim to build a bomb shelter that can withstand weight dropped from a height

Have you noticed that sometimes children can manage a task and the next day or time, they cannot?


Do you find yourself telling them this?

When we are in our window of tolerance, we feel just right! We are calm but not tired. We are alert but not anxious. We can cope with daily challenges as they happen.

On the day's children "Can't do", ask yourself if they are feeling hungry, frustrated, lonely or tired.

Attendance Notice:

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

Visibility

As Hillcroft is close to a very busy road and the evenings are getting darker and the weather is getting colder. If you are purchasing a new coat, please consider the colour of your child's coat and think about how visible they are when travelling to school.
