This week, Mrs Scott, one of our Reception teachers, shares her recommendations:

EYFS

The Storm Whale by Benji Davies

The stunning bestseller by Benji Davies, winner of the inaugural Oscar's First Book Prize.

Noi and his father live in a house by the sea, his father works hard as a fisherman and Noi often has only their six cats for company. So when, one day, he finds a baby whale washed up on the beach after a storm, Noi is excited and takes it home to care for it. He tries to keep his new friend a secret, but there's only so long you can keep a whale in the bath without your dad finding out. Noi is eventually persuaded that the whale has to go back to the sea where it belongs. For Noi, even though he can't keep it, the arrival of the whale changes his life for the better - the perfect gift from one friend to another.

KS1

Dinosaurs in the Supermarket by Timothy Knapman & Sarah Warburton

Who is hiding in the supermarket shelves and why can't the grown-ups see them? The dinosaurs are having a high old time, sneaking about the aisles and having a massive food fight in this lively picture book from an experienced writer and illustrator team. There are plenty of amusing dinosaur hiding places to spot in the bright and visually-entertaining page spreads. Young children will especially enjoy the familiarity of the supermarket setting, with its opportunities for identifying and naming fruits, vegetables and more. Combining this with dinosaurs will ensure this book is popular with young readers - and the denouement, in which the dinosaurs are seen cleaning up after themselves (and having fun doing it) is sure to please parents too!

The Water Horse by Dick King-Smith

The story begins with a mysterious egg washed up on a Scottish beach, the morning after a great storm. Kirstie and her brother Angus find the egg and take it home. The next day it has hatched into a tiny greeny-grey creature with a horse's head, warty skin, four flippers and a crocodile's tail. The baby sea monster soon becomes the family pet - but the trouble is, it just doesn't stop growing!

UKS2

Survivors by David Long & Kerry Hyndman


Beautifully presented in a large, paperback format, and fully illustrated in colour throughout, this wonderful anthology is a treat for all the family. Be shocked and amazed by these incredible real-life stories of extreme survival, including . . .

The Man Who Sucked Blood from a Shark, a sailor who survived for 133 days on a raft in the Atlantic when his ship was torpedoed, using shark's blood in place of fresh water.

The Girl Who Fell from the Sky, a teenager who fell 2 miles from an aeroplane and trekked through the Amazon jungle to safety. The Woman Who Froze to Death - Yet Lived, a woman who was trapped under freezing water for so long her heart stopped. Four hours later, medics managed to warm her blood enough to revive her.

Combining classic tales such as Ernest Shackleton's Antarctic voyage, as well as more modern exploits such as the adventurer who inspired the movie 127 Hours, these astonishing stories will be retold by young readers to all of their friends.


The workshop will be in the school hall and we expect it to last for about 45 minutes. It is aimed at families with children in EYFS & KS1 but everyone is welcome.

Attendance Notice:

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.
