Highlights of 2016-17

As we come to the end of another term, it gives us time to reflect on the past year of which Hillcroft has had a very busy and successful one. Some of the achievements from our children this year have included:

Volunteers

We would like to send a big thank you to all the volunteers that give up their own time to come into school and help with activities such as listening to readers, general help in class and supporting on school trips and visits. Friends of Hillcroft

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the hard working and dedicated Friends of Hillcroft. With events such as the school Quiz Night, termly discos, a wonderful Christmas and Summer Fair, large amounts of money have been raised which enormously helps purchase things for the children in the school. A couple of the larger projects they have undertaken and funded this academic year are the Woodland School Library which gives the children much enjoyment on a weekly basis and the second gate to access the playground which has eased the busy times of the school day.

Attendance

We are very happy and proud to report the improvement that Hillcroft has seen this year with 41 children accomplishing 100% attendance across this year and over 122 children who have achieved 100% attendance this term. This attendance is pleasing to report as the relationship between high attendance and children's progress in their learning is very strong.



Please can I remind you for September that the school bell rings at 8.45am which is the expected time for children to be in school. Registers are taken at 8.55am and therefore if your child arrives in school after this, they will be considered late, receiving a late mark. If your child is unwell and cannot attend school, please ensure you telephone the school office before 8.45am to inform us as it is vital we know a child will be off school prior to the registers.

Punctuality

We have appreciated parents support this year to ensure children are at school punctually for an 8.45am start and this has significantly improved across the year. We would like to remind parents that parents need to pick children up on time after school too. The office staff will not be available to oversee any children who are late from September and therefore collection at 3.00pm for Early Years and Key Stage 1 and 3.10pm for Key Stage 2 is essential.

Go Green Awards

We are pleased to report that the number of Go Green behaviour awards have increased each term throughout this academic year. These awards are given to those children who remain on green or gold all term, demonstrating a consistent approach to the schools STRONG values and behaviour system.

In the Autumn term 72% of children received these, in the Spring it increased to 77% and in the Summer it has further increased to 82%.

Uniform

At Hillcroft, we believe and view school uniform as an essential part of school life as it gives the children a sense of confidence and pride in themselves therefore full school uniform is compulsory for daily attendance. School uniform does include footwear and therefore it is important to note that children need to wear school shoes not trainers, canvas shoes or boots. Children will be asked to change into black school plimsolls that are kept in the school office should they not be in appropriate footwear.

Please can I also remind parents that PE uniform is also compulsory and should be in school at all times for PE lessons. Any child who does not have a PE kit on the days of PE will borrow one from the school office to wear. PE kit for Hillcroft from September is black shorts, black plimsolls and we have introduced new PE shirts in house colours which are available from the uniform supplier. Please note, black hot pants for girls or football shorts for boys are not allowed. If your child wears tights in the winter, please also ensure they have a spare pair of white socks for PE.
