#### Harvest Assembly

As we are approaching harvest time, Hillcroft will be collecting for the Caterham Food Bank this year. The Caterham Food Bank is part of a nationwide network of foodbanks, supported by the Trussel Trust, working to combat poverty and hunger across the UK. They provide three days nutritionally balanced emergency food and support to local people who are referred to them in crisis. No one in our community should have to face going hungry! Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from redundancy to receiving an unexpected bill on a low income. A simple box of food makes a big difference. Over 90% of the food distributed by foodbanks in the Trussell Trust network, is donated by the public. They would welcome donations of non-perishable food items but particularly UHT milk, powdered milk, tinned sponge puddings and tinned rice puddings, also deodorant and bags for life are very useful. Please hand any donations in to the school office from Monday 16<sup>th</sup> October to Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October.
